Vedi Hadiz is Professor of Asian Societies and Politics at the Asia Research Centre, Murdoch University and an Australian Research Council Future Fellow. He is also Adjunct Professor of Sociology at the University of Indonesia. He was previously Associate Professor of Sociology at the National University of Singapore.

He graduated from the Faculty of Social and Political Sciences at the University of Indonesia in 1987 and received his PhD at Murdoch University in 1996. He had previously worked in Indonesia in the journal Prisma and in the Society of Political and Economic Studies in Jakarta.

Professor Hadiz is the author of Localising Power in Post-Authoritarian Indonesia: A Southeast Asia Perspective (Stanford University Press 2010), Reorganising Power in Indonesia: The Politics of Oligarchy in An Age of Markets (with Richard Robison; RoutledgeCurzon 2004) and Workers and the State in New Order Indonesia

(Routledge 1997). He is the editor or co-editor of several books, including Empire and Neoliberalism in Asia (Routledge 2006) and Social Science and Power in Indonesia (with Daniel Dhakidae; Equinox/ISEAS 2005).

He has published in a number of journals, including New Political Economy, Development and Change, Pacific Review, Journal of Contemporary Asia, Journal of Development Studies, Indonesia, Critical Asian Studies and Democratization).
